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During your stay there are also lots of things to see such as:

Maid of the Mist Boat Tour – Don your waterproof poncho and cruise to the base of the American Falls, then to the basin of the Horseshoe Falls. It's an unforgettable 30 minute adventure into the wet and wild on the world famous Maid of the Mist.

Cave of the Winds – The Cave of the Winds brings you face-to-face with the pounding waters of Niagara Falls! Clad in your yellow poncho and souvenir sandals, you'll travel deep into the gorge and journey under the Falls. Get soaked on the Hurricane Deck where you are mere feet from the thundering waters.

Buffalo & Erie County Naval Park – The largest inland naval park of its kind in the U.S. It is home to a guided missile cruiser, the USS Little Rock, destroyer, the USS The Sullivans and submarine, the USS Croaker. Experience how mariners and submariners lived and carried out their patriotic duty to their nation.

Lockport Locks & Erie Canal Cruises – Experience a unique 2 hour cruise which include "locking through" and being raised the 49 feet of the Niagara Escarpment in the only double set of locks on the Erie Canal. You will pass under bridges that raise straight up, see water cascade over Lockport's famous "Flight of Five" 1840's locks as your captain describes the architecture, sights and folklore along the way. After the cruise enjoy a full buffet luncheon at Canalside Emporium.

Old Fort Niagara – Begun by France in 1726 on the site of earlier French forts, later controlled by Britain and the United States, and supporting a military presence even today, Fort Niagara presents a unique and exciting historical panorama; the evolution of a major North American fortress over more than three centuries.

Herschell Carousel Factory Museum – Ride an antique 1916 hand carved wooden carousel. Listen to the musical sounds of a 1917 Wurlitzer #125 military band organ. View a National Historic Site which houses the Mary W. Lockman menagerie collection of carousel animals as well as Wurlitzer Band Organ roll production equipment. See a wood carving shop and works in progress.

Niagara Power Project's Power Vista – The Niagara Power Project is New York's largest generating facility and one of the largest in the United States.

Frank Lloyd Wright Homes - The Martin House Complex is a prime example of a Prairie House, a revolutionary design developed by Frank Lloyd Wright in the first decade of the 20th century. The Prairie House style is characterized by rectilinear, horizontally-oriented structures linked by crossing axes and "woven" into their site. The Martin House complex was designed in this fashion, allowing clear, linear vistas throughout the various buildings and surrounding landscape.

You will be able to sign up for tours of these wonderful places upon your arrival at the Rally.

There will be entertainment on at least Saturday and Sunday evenings following dinner. Saturday evening will be an evening of blues performed by The Lakeside Blues Band, a local group with a well known reputation. Sunday's entertainment will be provided by "Merry Mischief," a local duo specializing in acoustic traditional music.

On Friday, consider a special dinner in one of the many area or city restaurants or grill outside with your fellow campers. Afterwards enjoy campfires and relaxed activities.

We plan to have a "Hassel Tassel," Open House and Seminars.

Have you ever thought of "Geocaching"? The Region 2 Rally may be the place to give it a try!
